Per FAA Order 8130.2, Airworthiness Certification of Aircraft, Chapters 12 through 16, operating limitations are issued as part of an aircraft's Special Airworthiness Certificate which typically, depending on revision, include requirements for pilot ratings/authorizations to act as PIC of the aircraft holding a Special Airworthiness Certificate.
